## NHPBS TACKLES PANDEMIC HEAD ON

Responding to a critical need for in-depth analysis of the coronavirus pandemic, in April 2020, New Hampshire PBS launched a new digital series: THE STATE WE'RE IN.

Hosted by Granite State News Collaborative Director Melanie Plenda, the series explores solutions to the crisis and highlights local efforts to combat the virus and rebuild local economies.

THE STATE WE'RE IN has covered topics such as the impact on small businesses, remote learning, telehealth, absentee voting and tenant evictions. We also have made it a priority to reach out to underserved state residents, and we are working to develop Spanish-language content.

THE STATE WE'RE IN was the title of one of the first public affairs programs on New Hampshire PBS. This series seeks to revive the in-depth reporting and civil discourse that once was the hallmark of public affairs and discussion shows in the state. # NHPBS PIVOTS AND PARTNERS

In a time like no other, the need for access to accurate and trustworthy information is essential. From the PBS NewsHour to local services, New Hampshire PBS is a trusted source of news and information to so many Granite Staters.

At the very beginning of the pandemic, we shifted our production team to LIVE stream Governor Sununu's weekly press conferences on the [nhpbs.org](https://www.nhpbs.org) website, along with YouTube and Facebook, allowing viewers to stream online anytime, anywhere.

Thanks to the support of Granite Society members Senator Martha Fuller Clark and Dr. Geoffrey Clark, everyone in New Hampshire now has access to Governor Sununu's crucial public safety updates through new equipment that allows us to broadcast live to YouTube and Facebook and simultaneously record the briefing for posting on our website.

## NHPBS REACHES FOR THE TOP

For over 150 years, the Mt. Washington Auto Road has guided millions of visitors to the top of the highest peak in New England, developing a culture all its own along the way. New Hampshire PBS created a new documentary, MT. WASHINGTON AUTO ROAD TO THE SKY, highlighting Auto Road employees, historians and thrill-seekers as they celebrate the rich history of this New England icon.


To long-time Mt. Washington Auto Road stage driver Rik Dow, the appeal of The Rockpile is timeless. “Once the mountain gets its hooks into you, it doesn’t let go,” he says.

That might explain how the road came to be, despite the odds against it when construction began. “You have to remember this was the 1850s,” says Mt. Washington Auto Road general manager Howie Wemyss. “There was no mechanized equipment whatsoever. Everything was done with horse-drawn or oxen-drawn carts and raw muscle power.”

By 1861, the road was opened to carriages. It wasn’t until 1899 that the carriage road began its transition to an Auto Road, when Freelan Stanley made the ascent in a steam car. Later in 1904, the Auto Road hosted one of the first auto races in the United States—The Mt. Washington Hillclimb—a tradition that continues to this day.

For those taking on the Auto Road without an automobile, the route has a punishing 12% grade incline, but the challenge is part of the appeal. “It’s one of the toughest hill climbs in the world,” says Sean Snow, a cyclist in the Mt. Washington Auto Road Bicycle Hillclimb. “This is one of the first races I’ve done that I’ve never thought about my competitors at all. I have one competitor, and that’s Mount Washington.”

While there are many who love the challenge presented by the Auto Road, part of its enduring appeal is that it makes the spectacular beauty of Mt. Washington accessible to everyone. ## NHPBS SHARES STORIES TO CREATE COMMUNITY


“As I’ve been learning more about New England history and seeing more of these stories, I think ‘Wow, why haven’t I heard about this? I’ve lived in Boston my whole life.’” Chaya Harris, an educator and leader for Outdoor Afro, was joined by WINDOWS TO THE WILD host Willem Lange as she led a group of kayakers through Portsmouth Harbor and shared stories of the Black Jacks.

Black Jack was a term used for black sailors—men who played an integral role in 19th-century New England life. To Harris, the fact that their stories are so rarely told illustrates a larger problem with the narrative that often surrounds African Americans and the outdoors—a narrative she worries discourages Black people from experiencing nature. “My goal today,” she explains, “is to reclaim some of our space, reclaim our stories and share our stories.”

Outdoor Afro is a national non-profit dedicated to helping African Americans experience the outdoors. This is the second time Lange has joined them on an excursion. He first met Harris when she led a team up Mount Washington. Harris has been encouraged to enjoy the outdoors all her life, but she says that for many Black men and women, going for a hike or hopping in a kayak may not seem like a natural fit.

Harris seeks to bolster this sense of community with the history that is incorporated in Outdoor Afro outings. Today they focus on the Black Jacks, a group that included Frederick Douglass and Crispus Attucks. “It’s such a complex history and not just one story to be told,” says Harris.


