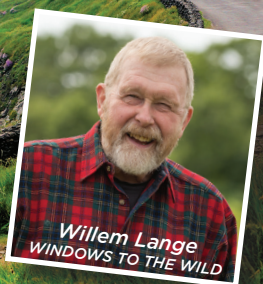

A GOLDEN OPPORTUNITY FOR THOUGHTFUL DISCUSSIONS

It takes a special person to take a national issue and connect it with people who can tackle it on a local level, and that's exactly what Jemi Broussard does for the NHPBS Indie Lens Pop Up film series at Red River Theatres in Concord.

Since 2012, Red River Theatres has shown PBS documentary films from the *Independent Lens* series for free. Jemi previews the films and then determines how they relate to what is happening in the Granite State – and that's when she gets creative.

“For instance,” Jemi explains, “I watched *Soul Food Junkies* and realized I had to look at the issue in a different way. So I thought of bringing a local chef to the screening and asked him to show us how to transform our junk food treats into something healthier.”

Jemi is a self-proclaimed film and television junkie. As she recalls past screenings one by one, you can feel her excitement about the films, the issues they expose and how the discussions help our neighbors right here in New Hampshire. “This particular film series is just golden. It is rich with important topics that people don't know about.”

“The last few seasons have been about race and social justice, so we've established connections with various agencies and experts in the state who can have thoughtful conversations about these relevant issues.”

Some films, like *The Providers*, are a perfect fit for the Red River Theatre audiences. The documentary examines how rural doctors help reach patients

that would otherwise be left out of the healthcare system. “This related well to New Hampshire's issues,” says Jemi. “It was a packed house, and a lively discussion followed with a panel of rural physicians. I could see lightbulbs going off throughout the theater as folks connected, shared information and helped each other out.”

Another film that Jemi thinks will hit home is *Bedlam*. It looks at how people are grappling with mental health issues and how police, hospitals, lawyers and prisons are overwhelmed and under-resourced to handle such a crisis. Jemi notes that, “New Hampshire is in the midst of this exact crisis. It will be a perfect opportunity to get us talking about how to help connect folks with services or share ideas on what is working and not working in our towns.”

Not all the films deal with heavy hitting issues. Last year an audience screened *Won't You Be My Neighbor?* and was privy to an insider conversation with Dover resident Paul Lally, who was a producer/director for *Mister Rogers' Neighborhood*.

“People genuinely love this series, and I think Indie Lens Pop Up allows our audiences to experience something important together, and with the right panel, they leave knowing more about a subject.”

Along with Red River Theatres, the Indie Lens Pop Up series is also shown at Franklin Pierce University in Rindge and at the Tillotson Center in Colebrook. Check out our website at nhpbs.org/events to attend the next Indie Lens Pop Up film screening near you.
