

LEAVING A LEGACY

We recently received a generous gift from the Estate of Elizabeth “Bess” Nutt to support arts and classical musical programming on **New Hampshire PBS**. Gifts like this are critical to our success, so in honor of Estate Planning Week, we set out to learn more about this fascinating lady.

Bess had multiple passions. The first was silversmithing, which she was introduced to at age 12 while attending summer camp in NH.

Bess’ silversmithing career took off in high school when she won a national award. Later her work was exhibited at the Carnegie Museum in Pittsburgh. After graduating from the Cleveland Institute of Art, Bess decided to pack up her things, head to New Hampshire, and buy an old farmhouse in Candia.

Bess put down roots, built a studio in her house and started creating stunning pieces of jewelry, salt and pepper shakers, sterling silver pitchers and unique pieces of tableware.

She built a national reputation as an accomplished silversmith, exhibited at the Currier Museum of Art,

taught at the University of New Hampshire and was the head of the Metalsmithing and Jewelry Department at the New Hampshire Institute of Art in Manchester

for over 20 years.

In 2007, Bess was awarded a lifetime achievement award from the League of New Hampshire Craftsmen.

In October 2016, Bess passed away. Paul Repasy, Jr., the son of Bess’ lifelong partner, Paul Repasy, Sr., recalls Bess’ love of metalsmithing and her other passions - operas, classical music and **New Hampshire PBS**.

In the last four years of her life, Bess was bedridden and classical music and opera were the biggest part of her life.

Paul Jr. would call Bess every week to check up on her, and there were many times she would interrupt their phone calls and say, “Okay Paul, I love talking to you, but my opera program is coming on and I’ve got to go.”

Opera and classical music freed Bess from her physical limitations and allowed her to become lost in the music, vivid stories and elaborate set designs of the operas she loved.

In the end, Bess knew exactly how she wanted her estate to be handled. She decided to leave a lasting legacy to **New Hampshire PBS**. This financial gift would allow NHPBS to continue to provide classic music and opera programs for everyone to enjoy.
